- (3) Recommendations for on 'how' and 'what' is needed *to enable women's rights organizations to exercise their expertise and role as first responders to women and girls* insights from different perspectives: the UN member states and civil society partners. These recommendations will be shared with the Action Coalition on Gender Based Violence to inform further discussion on targets and commitments to be agreed at the Generation Equality Forum taking place in Mexico City (29th-31st March 2021).
